Exodus 17:9-13 (NLT) ⁹ Moses commanded Joshua, "Choosé some men to go out and fight the army of Amalek for us. Tomorrow, I will stand at the top of the hill, holding the staff of God in my hand," 10 So Joshua did what Moses had commanded and fought the army of Amalek.
